Why are they disappearing?

POACHING

55 African elephants are killed everyday. Usually only their tusks are taken and their bodies are left to rot. Their tusks are sold as ivory & ornaments.

HABITAT LOSS

With human populations exploding, and land and forest areas taken for crops, elephant herds have nowhere to go. If they try to eat human crops, they're in trouble too.

African

- Larger/taller
- Bigger ears
- Two sub-species: Savannah and Forest elephants
- Two parts/'fingers' to end of trunk
- Males and females have tusks
- Around 400,000 left (listed as 'Vulnerable')

Did you know? There are 2 types of elephants...

Asian

- Smaller/less tall
- Smaller ears
- Four sub-species
- One part/'finger' to end of trunk
- Only some males have tusks
- Around 50,000 left (listed as 'Endangered')

CAPTIVITY

One in three Asian elephants are captive and work for humans. Working elephants, and zoo/circus elephants suffer stress and die sooner than wild elephants.


