



# Hedgehogs Matter - Environmental Worksheet 12b



**Bet you didn't know these facts about hedgehogs!**

- There are at least 14 species of hedgehogs around the world.
- Hedgehogs are NOT rodents as some people think. They are mammals and are distant cousins of shrews.
- In surveys the hedgehog is usually Britain's favourite wild animal.
- Hedgehogs have a small tail, not easily visible under all those spikes.

**Why are hedgehogs disappearing?** Loss of habitat, Clearing of gardens, hedges, bushes and trees, Gardening machinery, Cars on roads, Bonfires, Lack of food due to garden poisons being used.



Draw a plan of your garden or a park/school garden, adding in hedgehog-friendly features like holes in fences, piles of leaves or logs, bushes or hedgehog houses so they can sleep undisturbed, and wild plants which encourage the bugs that hedgehogs eat.

**Did you know hedgehogs are mainly carnivores (meat eaters)?** They eat all sorts of creepy-crawlies, especially beetles, earwigs and earthworms, as well as caterpillars, slugs, snails, bees, wasps, grasshoppers, centipedes and flies (yum, yum).



To help hedgehogs, you can put out speciality hedgehog food (pellets or meat) or a little cat food or dog food in a shallow dish, as well as water. Don't give them bread or milk.
