
According to IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature), we produce over 300 million tons of plastic every year.


ever-known-earth-4858813 Type of ocean debris | Plastic | Other debris

Answer: One blue whale weighs:  $300,000,000 \div 3,000,000 = 100$  tons.
